



## 6 steps of hand hygiene



rub hands palm to palm



right palm over left dorsum with interlaced fingers and vice versa



palm to palm with fingers interlaced



backs of fingers to opposing palms with fingers interlaced



rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa




rotational rubbing, backwards and forwards with clasped fingers of right hand in left palm and vice versa

## hand hygiene is the single most effective way of reducing healthcare-associated infections








### germs are everywhere including hospitals

curtains






toilet seats
